## **The Journey: Walking the Road to Bethlehem**

Join us each week during this Advent/Christmas season as we travel from Nazareth to Bethlehem to take a fresh look at the birth of Jesus Christ. This new worship series is based on United Methodist pastor, Adam Hamilton's book by the same name. Using historical information, archaeological findings, and personal reflections, we'll explore this most amazing moment in history. We follow the footsteps of Mary, Joseph, the shepherds, and others, gaining insight into our own journeys with Christ.

God is with us in new ways here at Old South with opportunities for learning, growing, deepening our faith and sharing our joy with others. The Living Nativity, complete with costumes, live animals and Reading Singers on the church lawn during the town tree lighting is a wonderful witness to the community that Jesus is the real reason for the Christmas season. And like Mary and Joseph, we, too, are anticipating the birth of a baby this Christmas season... as Rev. Carol and husband, Greg prepare to welcome their first child to their family and to the Old South Church family. God is leading newcomers of all ages and stages in their journeys to be a part of our church community. We are so blessed! We have been counting to one thousand, and more, gifts that God has given us.

Mary and Elizabeth have inspired generations with their profound understanding of what it means to be blessed by God. In the Magnificat, Mary "magnifies the Lord" and "rejoices in God her Savior." She recognizes how God has lifted the lowly and filled the hungry with good things. As we prepare our homes and hearts for the birth of God's most astounding gift, ponder how you, too, can lift up the lowly and feed the hungry. Have conversations in your home about how you plan to honor the Christ Child's birthday. 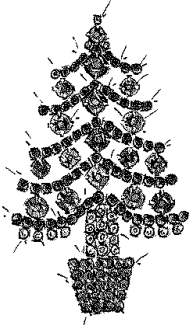

## **Alternative Giving: Helping the Least, the Last, and the Lost**



December is a wonderful time filled with favorite traditions, get togethers with friends and family, and an overall feeling of love. It is also a time of year when we can help those who have less enjoy a special gift and know that they too are loved. Old South has several opportunities to help:

**Angel Tree:** If you haven't already seen it, the Angel tree is in the vestry with opportunities for you to help make the holidays happier for a child in foster care. Some angel tags have specific wish list items for a child or teen and some ask for a typical gift for a girl or boy in a specific age range. The Lynn Department of Social Services often gets new cases close to the holiday and they try to have a gift for every child. **Angel tree gifts need to be returned to church by Sunday, December 14th.** Thank you for considering donating a gift to a needy child.

**SERRV:** SERRV gifts will be on sale in the vestry through December 14th. Please consider purchasing a hand-crafted item for a gift for someone on your list as the money helps to support craftspeople in a developing country.

**Collection for Orphanage in Haiti:** Old South is collecting items that are urgently needed at the Project Hope (Espwa) orphanage where Rachel Vinciguerra is working this year. With 500 children living at the orphanage, many pairs of shoes, underwear, t-shirts, pants, etc. are needed! There are children at the orphanage from age 9 months to 20 years so many sizes are needed and there is a bigger need for clothing for boys. Urgently needed items are:

- Clothes for warm weather ( t-shirts, pants, skirts, dresses, dress clothes) new or lightly used
- New underwear
- AA batteries
- Soccer balls, volley balls, basketballs (we'll send them uninflated)
- Backpacks and string bags (new or lightly used)

**The collection will run through December 14.** Please place your donations in the bin by the Angel Tree marked "Haiti Orphanage" in the vestry. Thank you!

November was a very busy month! We will also be preparing for our Christmas celebrations. The children in the 3 and 4 year old classes will walk through the story of 'The Very Special Baby' and sing songs for their families. Christmas celebrations will be held on Wednesday, December 17 and Thursday, Dec 18.

CCP will be closed for Christmas vacation from Dec 22 - Jan 2.

### Mission of the Month



The Outreach Committee has chosen World Mission Shares for the months of October through December. In October we highlighted Dr. Belinda Forbes of Accion Medica Cristiana, an agency within the New England Conference’s Covenant with Nicaragua. Some of its various programs are:

The Amanecer Mobile Medical Clinic serves 20,000 medical and 5,000 dental patients in 60 different communities yearly. The team consists of a doctor, dentist, nurse, and coordinator working 5 days/week and 48 weeks/year. Through donors’ contributions a second 5-day clinic was launched to visit the 60 communities every 6 weeks instead of 12. The Christian Medical Action organization is training 120 local community health workers over three years. Dr. Belinda Forbes serves as International Liaison for Community Health with CMA.

The Nutrition Program expanded to serving 450 children in five villages and 70,000 meals per year for NITCA and serves 2,600 meals per year to an elder program in La Cruz Verde. Vegetable gardens were started in five communities in 2013 with two plantings per year.

The Sewing Education Program teaches men and women how to sew and then sell their own creations to become self-sufficient. Forty women graduated in 2013.

### Thank you for UNICEF Donations



The Old South Sunday School kids and the children of CCP filled 35 boxes with change. As of November 19 the total is \$251.70 donated to UNICEF. As more boxes are returned that number will grow.

According to recent UNICEF statistics \$5.00 will buy a soccer ball for refugee camps, \$30.00 will purchase enough vaccine to protect 100 children from measles, and \$100.00 will provide a bicycle to deliver medicine to children.

Our donation can certainly make a difference. UNICEF is everywhere where children need clean water, health care, nutrition, education, emergency relief and so much more.
